

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President Temer's popularity holds virtually steady

The indicators measuring President Michel Temer's popularity have hardly changed as compared to December 2017. The percentage of those who rate the government as excellent or good fell from 6% to 5%, while the figure for those who approve of the president's way of governing remained unchanged at 9% and for those who have confidence in the government dropped from 9% to 8%.

The percentage that rates the government as bad or terrible edged down from 74% to 72% between December 2017 and March 2018. Nevertheless, compared with September 2017, the period in which the president's popularity hit its lowest point, the percentage is down by a total of five percentage points (from 77% to 72%). The decline was driven by an increase in the percentage of those who rate


the government as fair: up from 16% in September 2017 to 21% in March 2018.

With respect to the nine areas of government activity, the figures also remained practically unchanged, meaning that none of them showed changes above the margin of error. In the area of public security, the variation was more pronounced. The percentage of respondents who approve of government actions and policies moved up from 11% to 14%, while the figure for those who disapprove of the president's actions and policies fell from 86% to 84%.

News items about corruption continue to be uppermost in the respondents' memory. The federal intervention in the public security sector in Rio de Janeiro and the welfare reform complete the list of recent news stories most recalled by the population.




Evaluation of the Michel Temer administration

Percentage of responses (%)




Approval of the way of governing

Highlights by respondent profile

Approval ratings increase in the Northeast

President Temer's popularity has increased among residents in the Northeast region, even though this is still the region where the president receives his lowest approval rating. The percentage of respondents that rate the government as bad or terrible dropped by seven percentage points: down from 84% in December 2017 to 77% in March 2018. In contrast, the percentage of those who rate the government as fair is up from 11% to 16%.

Popularity increases among lowincome households

Among respondents with a household income of up to one minimum wage, the percentage of those who rate the government as bad or terrible declined by seven percentage points: down from 79% in December 2017 to 72% in March 2018. Within this same group, the percentage that rates the government as fair is up from 13% to 18%, while the figure for those who rate the Temer administration as excellent or good rose from 6% to 7%.

Popularity is higher among respondents educated up to the fourth grade of primary school

Among the respondents who studied until the fourth grade of primary school, 14% trust President Temer and 83% do not trust him. For the population as a whole, the percentages reach 8% and 89% respectively. Regarding the president's way of governing, the approval and disapproval ratings within the group who studied up to the 4th grade of primary school stand at 12% and 83% respectively. For all respondents taken together, the figures reach 9% and 87% respectively.




Comparison with the Dilma administration


Approval of the government by area

None of the nine government activity areas under analysis experienced changes above the margin of error. The most pronounced change was in the area of public security. The percentage of those who approve of government actions and policies moved up from 11% to 14%, while the figure for those who disapprove of the president's actions and policies fell from 86% to 84%.

A significant improvement in the assessment of the public security area was registered among residents in the Northeast and South regions. Approval ratings grew by 7 and 6 percentage points respectively, while disapproval ratings fell respectively by 7 and 8 percentage points. In the North and Midwest regions as a whole, the assessment deteriorated: approval ratings are down by 8 percentage points while disapproval ratings are up by 9 percentage points.



The percentage of respondents who report that recent news items about the government have been more unfavorable edged down from 56 percent in December 2017 to 51 percent in March 2018. The percentage of those who consider the news stories to be neither favorable nor unfavorable rose from 18% to 24%.

News items about corruption continue to be uppermost in the population's memory: 19% of respondents mentioned at least one news story related to corruption cases. It is worth noting that 10% of respondents mentioned "government corruption" without specifying the case, while 4% of them recall a news item related to the Lava Jato Operation.

At least one news story about the federal intervention in the public security sector in Rio de Janeiro (concerning the intervention itself or the release of federal funds to support it) is recalled by 5% of respondents. Likewise, 5% of respondents recall a news item related to the welfare reform (about its postponement or about the reform itself, but without specifying).


Perception of news about the government Percentage of responses (%) in March 2018






Evaluation of the government: from José Sarney to Michel Temer

Sample profile: 2,000 interviews in 126

municipalities.

Survey period: March 22-25, 2018. The estimated margin of error is 2 percentage points above or below the results found in the sample. The confidence level is 95%.
